Disclosure obligations

This return covers the period 1 July 2006 to 30 June 2007. It must be completed if you incurred more than \$10,300 in political expenditure during that period, or received a gift for such expenditure.

Registered political parties and their State branches, candidates and members of Senate groups, members of Federal Parliament, and Commonwealth Departments and agencies do not need to complete this form.

1. Political expenditure for financial year 1 July 2006 to 30 June 2007

If you incurred more than \$10,300 in political expenditure in the 2006–2007 financial year you must show the total for each of the following categories of expenditure on goods and services used or provided during the year, regardless of when payment was actually made.

Expenditure for purposes other than these categories is not political expenditure as defined by the Act and does not need to be reported.

1. Public expression of views on a political party, candidate in an election or member of the Federal Parliament by any means	\$ 0
2. Public expression of views on an issue in a Federal election by any means (other than those at items 1,3,4 or 5)	\$ 187,241
3. Printing, production, publication or distribution of any material (other than that at item 1 or item 2 above) that is required by section 328 or 328A of the Act to include a name, address or place of business	\$ 183,453
4. Broadcast of political matter in relation to which particulars are required to be announced under subclause 4(2) of schedule 2 to the <i>Broadcasting Services Act 1992</i>	\$ 169,905
5. Carrying out opinion polling or other research relating to a Federal election or the voting intentions of electors	\$ 14,635

What do sections 328 and 328A do?

Section 328 of the Act requires all electoral advertisements to include the name and address of the person who authorised the advertisement and, except in the case of newspapers, the name and place of business of the printer at the end.

Section 328A imposes a similar requirement on electoral advertisements on the internet.

Electoral advertisements must be authorised at all times, and not just during an election period.

What does subclause 4(2) of schedule 2 to the *Broadcasting Services Act 1992* do?

This requires the identification of those who have requested that political matter be broadcast. Guidelines at www.acma.gov.au are relevant.
